



- ③ Japanese respondents think democracy has a tendency to be time-consuming for solving problems.

Democracy has the tendency that it takes too much time to solve problems, and that it is difficult to reach a consensus. (SA)




- ④ About the training to debate, 83.1% of Japanese respondents have not received any, while 68.0% of Swedish people have received the training to debate.




